The Team have also removed weeds, and created some beautiful shrub beds. Good job Team, these look lovely!




Have you seen our Damp and Mould Advice Guide?

This could be 'alarming'

Do you test your smoke alarms? Did you know that testing your smoke alarm regularly is part of your tenancy agreement?

As a result, we expect you to test your smoke alarms once and week and let us know if they are not working properly. Don't forget to clean the dust off them once a year! (And then test it again to make sure it is still working!)

If you are deaf or hard of hearing, get in touch with our Repairs Team so we can make sure that you have the right smoke alarm for you.



Tell us if you spot something

Do you live in a block of flats or Independent Living Community with shared areas?

If so, it is important you tell us straight away if you see any faults or damage, or if your fire doors do not self-close.

Fire doors are an important fire safety feature. They only protect you and your family if they work properly, as they help stop the spread of fire when they are closed.

We are currently carrying out the Annual Fire Door Survey to make sure that all the doors meet safety standards. Please do get in touch with our Repairs Team if you have any questions.



Don't forget!

Please do not keep or store anything in your communal areas, corridors or front doors! Our Housing Officers take a zero-tolerance approach to this as is it a health and safety requirement.

One of the biggest fire risks is rubbish or junk stored in the wrong place – it can stop you from escaping your home in an emergency or cause you to fall.

If our Housing Officers spot items where they shouldn't be, you could:

- be charged for rubbish removal
- ▶ be in breach of your tenancy or lease and risk facing enforcement action.





Domestic Abuse Support

Are you worried that someone you know may be being abused? Or, are you worried for yourself?

It doesn't have to be an emergency before you can find help. It's important you tell someone, you are not alone.

Worried about debt?

Did you know that nearly one in ten people turned to loan sharks to help cover the costs of Christmas 2021 and there are fears that this number was even higher over Christmas 2022.

We have a dedicated Money Advice Team who can help and advise with money worries – which we know is more important then ever at the

If you are worried about debt or need cash fast, Loan Sharks can look tempting, but these are not your friends and the debt can often spiral out of control. If you have borrowed money from an illegal money lender, you can get help and support via www.stoploansharks.co.uk or call 0300 555 2222.

If you are looking for a loan at the moment, before you borrow any money, make sure your lender is genuine by visiting the Financial Services website which can be found at **www.register.fca.org.uk** and you could also consider the local, ethical, not for profit alternative lenders you can use. Cost of Living Payments 2023

Millions will receive new Cost of Living support from Spring 2023. Exact payment windows will be announced closer to the time but are spread across a longer period to ensure that consistent support is offered throughout the year. The first payment expected is £301, and will be received by those eligible in the Spring of 2023 and second payment of £300 is expected during the Autumn. Some households will be entitled to a £150 disability payment in the Summer.

What made you want to be a Tenant Board Member?


