

Every Little Helps



We know that the cost-of-living crisis is a serious problem for many of our tenants at the moment and we want to help where we can. We have got together with some amazing partners to try and help and we are also working to support a number foodbanks across the county.



In the Oswestry area we are working very closely with OsNosh who currently provide "pay as you feel" hot meals every Wednesday and Friday from The

Centre in Oak Street, Oswestry. They also have share tables of groceries available to take home, again on a "pay as you feel" basis.

In the New Year we are going to start running cooking workshops, in partnership with OsNosh. These are designed to help you reduce your food bills and the energy needed to cook. These will take place either in our Community Rooms or at The Centre in Oswestry. We are also working with The Qube Dial a Ride who have agreed to transport tenants to these workshops.

The workshops will also make use of the "pay as you feel" food share table where you will be able to supplement your weekly shop and you will learn how to make the best use of your slow cooker. After each workshop everyone will be more than welcome to sit and eat together or even just have a cup of tea and a chat.

Benches

For a long time residents in different areas across the county had been asking for more benches to go in their local areas. Having a place to sit and pass the time of day with your neighbours, somewhere where you can watch the world go by.

Well, you asked for it so we did it!

During October we installed 15 new benches in 10 separate communities. These environmentally friendly benches are made from 100% recycled plastic and designed to last decades without rotting or splintering and won't need any maintenance.

Let's look forward to sunny weather next year so that you can enjoy your new benches.

What we expect from you

We work hard to keep your homes in the best condition we can, but it is a two way process. As a tenant there are things that we expect you to do to keep your home safe and sound - like fixing minor things like chips or cracks in the wall or damaged internal doors.

One way to look after your home is to check if your extractor fans are working. Some of the new fans are designed to be on 24 hours a day. Don't worry - it only costs £1.75 per year* to keep your bathroom fan on. It costs £1.95 per year* to keep the kitchen fan on. Having the kettle on for ten minutes a day costs an estimated £17.98 per year.*

Keeping the fans on (or making sure they are full working order) helps to keep condensation to a minimum.

*these prices may have increased due to changes in energy costs and inflation
