Over the summer we had another very successful round of skips events – 16 events across the county saved over 9 tonnes of waste from landfill.

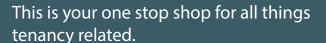

Keeping safe at home

Did you know about our community alarms? These are a small pendant that you wear around your neck or on your wrist and allows you to get help at the touch of a button.

Our alarms allow you to remain independent in your own home by providing the security that comes with knowing that calling for help is as quick and easy as pressing a button.



The alarm consists of a small unit that is connected to your phone socket and, when you press the button on your pendent, it puts you straight through to a team of trained advisors 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

£400 Energy Support Payment is coming

This will be paid automatically to every household and the total amount will be split over six months, giving you a monthly discount that you won't have to pay back.

Benefit and Pension Cost of Living Payments

If you receive certain benefits, you may be entitled to additional payments. You won't need to apply for these payments, they will be automatically paid into your bank.
